QUALIFICATIONS FOR ADMISSION

1. Bachelor's degree in any field from the institutions accredited by the Ministry of Education, Thailand
2. A minimum CGPA of 2.50 on 4.00 scale

ENTRANCE REQUIREMENTS

1. A completed application form
2. Official transcript of the previous university attended (1 copy)
3. Bachelor's degree certificate (1 copy)
4. Citizen identification card and house registration (1 copy) - for Thai applicants
5. Passport (1 copy) - for Non-Thai applicants
6. Three (1x1.5 inches) photographs (formal attire, not in graduation gown)

For overseas graduates, all documents submitted at time of application must be translated and certified, attested, or notarized with official seal or stamp from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Ministry of Education or related department.

ADMISSION FEE 1,000 THB (Non-refundable)

EXEMPTION

The AU English Proficiency Test can be exempted depending on which of the following conditions you satisfy.

- a TOEFL score of (iBT) 90 or (PBT) 575 or an IELTS (Academic) score of at least 6.5 (Validation: Two years)
- a Bachelor's degree or a higher degree from native English speaking countries (e.g. USA, Canada, UK, Australia and New Zealand)

- Have obtained library and financial clearance with the University
- Have demonstrated good behavior and discipline
- Have completed Professional Development Experience of 45 hours
- Have obtained a cumulative grade point average of at least 3.00
- Have proposed the thesis and passed the final oral thesis defense evaluated by a committee appointed by the university. The final oral defense is open to the public.

- Have completed all the courses of the curriculum
- Have obtained a cumulative grade point average at least 3.00
- Have completed Professional Development Experience of 45 hours
- Have passed the oral and / or written comprehensive examination
- Have proposed the Independent study and passed the final oral independent study defense evaluation by a committee appointed by the University. The final oral defense is open to the public.
- Have the independent study/part of the independent study published in any retrievable form
- Have obtained library and financial clearance with the University
- Have demonstrated good behavior and discipline
